Executive Checklist: Craps Game Vulnerability

Leadership Awareness

- When was the last time senior leadership reviewed craps-specific risks?
- Do decision-makers understand some dice scams can't be detected after the fact?
- Is craps viewed as a revenue driver or a legacy game assumed to manage itself?

Staff Knowledge & Coverage

- Can every boxperson explain how the mirror is used protect the game?
- Do supervisors know the security features on *your* dice, not generic dice?
- Is craps Game Protection knowledge consistent across all shifts?

Training Reality Check

- Has any craps Game Protection training occurred in the last 12 months?
- Does training include recognition of live dice manipulation?
- Are refresher sessions required or assumed necessary?

Operational Vulnerabilities

- Are staffing levels driven by Game Protection needs or headcount reduction?
- Have hybrid craps games been evaluated for new risk exposure?
- Is anyone responsible for observing how the game is played in real time?

Dice & Equipment Controls

- Do all dice include a logo or marking on the ace?
- Are staff trained to visually recognize misspotted dice without touching them or depending on the mirror for confirmation?
- Is there a clearly defined, rapid response protocol when misspotted dice are detected?

Detection Timing & Culture

- Are dice checks focused on during-play awareness, rather than end-of-roll review?
- Are staff confident that management will support them when they report suspicious activity?
- When results deviate from expected house advantage, is the variance analyzed—or simply accepted?

Final Question: If a sophisticated dice scam occurred today, how confident are you that it would be recognized while it was happening, not after it was over?
